Publishes a quarterly newsletter on the happenings of Wooster Players. Coordinates the troupe's attendance at various local HS and Community theatrical productions.

In addition, all officers must:

- Be available for a back to school retreat to be coordinated with schedules sometime in July

- Attend bi-monthly thespian officer meetings to plan and coordinate various events
- Be prepared to attend school meetings including Wooster Boosters, Advisory Board, etc.
- Participate in all Wooster Players events such as Street Painting, 9th grade registration, Holiday lane, etc.

If you are planning to run, please prepare a five-minute presentation that showcases your strengths and abilities that will aid you in fulfilling the requirements of the office and benefiting our program. You can do whatever you wish for your presentation and creativity is highly encouraged. Each student running for office must be an active member of the troupe for at least one school year. Elections will be held the day of the thespian induction ceremony; officers will be elected by a majority vote on a secret written ballet. The results will then be revealed at the awards barbeque and those elected will assume their positions immediately. The 2018-2019 officer positions:

Vice President / Historian

The vice-president presides in the absence of the president and is responsible for the induction of new members. Keeps a scrapbook of news clippings, posters, programs, etc.

Secretary / Scribe

The secretary/scribe keeps the records (minutes) of meetings and attends to troupe correspondence. In addition, keeps the points records of all activities: plays, productions dates, casts, crews, and work accomplished as provided by the official point system

Publicist

Coordinate publicity for all Wooster Players events: posters, press release, flyers, announcements, webpage (to be created). Take pictures at each event to upload to various WP social media. Contact local media to promote events.
