IB HL Solo Theatre Project

The HL Solo Theatre Project is an independent project in which the student chooses a theatre theorist, researches their theories, and creates a 4-8 minutes piece of theatre based on an aspect of the theory. The project is completely independent, and only the student can be featured in the performance. However, they are allowed a tech crew and peer mentors. This year, there is one IB HL Theatre senior —Ann Snelgrove - so she will be the sole student completing the project. Ann is

currently researching the theorist Antonin Artaud and the Theatre of Cruelty; she will showcase her piece in front of the IB Theatre class seventh period. Be on the look for more information about possibly attending this event.

State Showcase

Every year after the Northern Nevada Thespian Competition. the Wooster Players showcase the pieces that received either excellent or superior scores at regionals. These are the competition pieces that students from our Advanced and IB Theatre classes will be taking to the Nevada State Thespian Conference in March. This year, all twenty students that competed at regionals qualified, many even receiving superior scores in their categories. This means there will be a large variety of pieces at the showcasemonologues, scenes, musical
